Planting with Native and Drought Tolerant Plants

Morongo Reservation is in a unique area of ecoregions and microclimates. To the east lies the Colorado (Sonoran) Desert, to the west is chaparral a Mediterranean climate, and up the slopes of the mountain ranges are the oaks and pine forest. Also the riparian (streamside) habitats in the area have an assortment of lush water loving plants. The Morongo Reservation location allows for a large plant diversity, allowing for a wide variety of choices for landscaping.

On the backside are images and names of trees, shrubs and grasses that can be used to landscape your property. The plants chosen are drought tolerant, require less water, fertilizer, maintenance and pest control, than the more traditional landscaping. All these factors considered when landscaping your property will potentially save you time and money.


Things to consider before planting:
